Agenda item 2: Orientation Session for New Members

Recommendation

PIDC Board Members are invited to:

- a) note their responsibilities as Board Members; and
- b) **support** the Secretariat operations whenever needed or required.

Purpose

This session intends to introduce new and current Board Members to their roles and the functions of the Board within the PIDC organisational structure.

Background

- 2. This induction session has been developed to introduce Members to their role as PIDC Board Members. The Regular Annual Meeting and PIDC Board have developed high standards of meeting procedures, presentations, reports, and discussions that seek to promote good governance in the organisation. These introductory orientation sessions have been established to maintain these high standards with guidelines set in place to standardise practices which are open to change as and when circumstances require.
- 3. The establishment of PIDC's legal entity status now requires the Board to act on behalf of the PIDC Membership to provide governance oversight of the day-to-day operational activity of the PIDC Secretariat, other Subsidiary Bodies and Committees. This functionality of the Board is outlined in the PIDC Constitution.
- 4. Each Member on the Board shall in this regard be required to appoint a representative of seniority to act on its behalf in the exercise of Board functions and that representatives shall be empowered to fully participate in Board functions and decision-making processes. Board Members bring a wide range of skills and expertise to their role, but they will not necessarily have a full understanding of working within the PIDC environment. Consequently, the orientation programme provides the opportunity for Board Members to familiarise themselves with the PIDC working environment.
