Agenda item 8: PNGICA Hosted IBMS Workshop Update

Proposed Recommendations:

The Board is invited to:

- a) note the update for the Integrated Border Management System (IBMS) Workshop to be hosted by Papua New Guinea Immigration & Citizenship Authority (PNGICA) from 20-21 April 2023; and
- b) **task** the Secretariat to continue working with PNGICA to finalise workshop logistics and participation of all approved PIDC Member representatives.

Purpose

The purpose of this paper is to brief the Board on the Integrated Border Management System (IBMS) Workshop to be hosted by Papua New Guinea Immigration & Citizenship Authority (PNGICA) from 20–21 April 2023 at the Stanley Hotel and Suites, in Port Moresby, PNG.

Background

2. The PIDC Chairman and the Chief Migration Officer for PNGICA during his opening speech at the PIDC 2022 Regular Annual Meeting (RAM) made a commitment that PNG will provide capacity building support to PIDC Members. As part of that commitment, PNGICA will host the IBMS Workshop for PIDC Members from 19-21 April 2023 in Port Moresby, PNG. The purpose of the workshop is for pacific nations to come together to discuss border management solutions, with focus given to following a process to ensure that the end solution is fit for purpose for respective members across the region.

Update

- 3. This Pacific specific regional workshop will comprise a series of presentations, technology demonstrations, group discussions and panel discussions with PIDC colleagues and experts from across the Pacific region who will be participating in the 2-day regional forum to share information on their experiences with existing border management systems across the Pacific. Attached as annex 2 is a copy of the workshop programme.
- 4. PNGICA is facilitating all travel and entry procedures for PIDC Board Members and selected PIDC delegates. Delegates will not be required to apply for a visa prior to, or on arrival to PNG. The Board Members and selected PIDC delegates were requested to provide a copy of a valid passport number bio-data page to assist PNGICA to facilitate their travel and entry procedure.

- 5. PNGICA as host committed to funding the cost of accommodation at the Standley Hotel and per diems for two (2) participants from each member country. While Members were requested to fund air travel costs to and from PNG to attend the workshop, the Secretariat approached UNDP, Immigration NZ Hakili Matagi programme for possible support, and together with PIDC jointly supported the costs of air travel for 23 participants, inclusive of the ten (10) Board Members and three (3) PIDC staff to attend the workshop. Attached as Annex 2 is a list of participants for the IBMS Workshop.
- 6. The Secretariat continues to work with PNGICA on all travel and meeting arrangements for Board and workshop delegates participation and ensuring arrangements are finalised prior to the meeting.

Financial Implications

7. PNGICA is funding the cost of accommodations and per diem for the confirmed Member participants listed in Annex 2. Air fare, transit costs including accommodations and per diems to and from PNG for the participants are co-funded by PIDC, UNDP, and Immigration NZ Hakili Matagi Programme through an agreed arrangement. Per diems during the Board Meeting will be funded by PIDC for Board Members while PNGICA will be responsible for all in country costs related to the regional workshop from 19-21 April 2023.
