When & Why do we need to reference?

When do we need to reference?

Every time you use someone's ideas or quotes, you need to reference that source

Why do we need to reference?

- To avoid plagiarism i.e. using other peoples' work as if its your own
- 2. To give credit to the sources you've used
- 3. So the reader can do they

APA Reference consists of two elements:

- 1. In text citation
- 2. Reference/Bibliography



In-Text Citation

In-text Citations: direct quotation example

Footnote Style

Features:

- Appears at the bottom of the page, corresponding to the reference numbers in the text
- * The reference number appears in superscript at the end of the clause or sentence it refers to

Davis argues that the theory is "sound,"¹ but other researchers have contradicted this assessment.² Regardless, our concern in this essay is to show that the theory is inadequate for Footnote numbers

ibid = same as last entry

Use ibid when two references in a row are from the same source.

Key Takeaways
