Partnerships Supporting Solomon Islands Pacific Games 2023

PACIFIC GAMES



Solomon Islands Immigration Division prepares for Pacific Games by:

- June 2022, SIID conducted a review of its immigration border processes, concluding that a unique process is needed to facilitate the large volumes of passengers expected for Pacific Games.
- August 2022, SIID engages PNG ICSA counterpart to discuss leveraging from PNG's experience in facilitating large volumes of passengers through APEC and other events.
- September 2022, SIID and PNG ICSA start their collaboration with a series of video conferences.



Bilateral Engagements For the Pacific Games:

- October 2022 SIID delegation travels to PNG to draft MOU and establish Games Action Plan.
- May 2023 Solomon Islands delegation travels to PNG and MOU is signed.
- January, March, July, August & October 2023 ICSA Delegation travels to Solomon Islands to assist in Games preparations.
- Multiple video and teleconferences between ICSA and SIID teams.
- November 2023, ICSA deploy a team of 8 officers and ABF deploy 2 officers to Honiara for one month to assist SIID with the Games.

PNG aids SI immigration

THE country is keen to provide support to other Pacific lisland nations to strengthen border security, Papua New Guinea chief migration officer Stanis Hulahau says. Hulahau said PNG Immigration and Citizenship Authority (PNG ICA) would assist the Solomon Islands (SI) build its capacity on border security.

The commitment follows a draft memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the sister agencies in both nations following a recent bilateral meetings.

Hulahau noted strengthening security was among PNG ICA's key performance areas as well as that of the Government. In October 2019, Solomon Islands Prime Minister

Manasseh Sogavare first met Prime Minister James Marape in Port Moresby where they discussed mutual interests on

border security, Bougainville referendum, economic, trade and investment, labour mobility and employment opportunities and the Melanesian Spearhead Group.

It was also during this discussion that Marape pledged his support to the Solomon Islands for the Pacific Games which would be hosted in Honiara in November this year.

Under the draft MOU, PNG ICA was expected to provide technical assistance to SI immigration division to process and facilitate athletes, visitors and heads of delegations of the participating countries.

Apart from the technical assistance which includes the development of a travel application to process bulk visa applications, PNG ICA would also assist its sister agency with promotional items and branding materials.

"It is the new start of our long relationship and our collective efforts to strengthening security and border control between our maritime borders," Hulahau said.

He said the memorandum of understanding was at an advanced stage and was expected to be signed once clearance was given by the State Solicitor.

It covered ongoing security cooperation, PNG ICA support for SI immigration for the Pacific Games 2023, joint border operations, capacity building, training and information sharing.



Solomon Islands Border Management System

"*A trilateral initiative between Solomon Islands, Papua New Guinea and Australia*"



Solomon Islands Border Management System (BMS) journey so far:

- August 2023, SIID write to Australia seeking support for funding of a BMS.
- September-October 2023, PNG ICSA and Australian Home Affairs deploy technical officers to assess SI's needs and create a Business Requirements Document (BRD).
- February 2024, Australia confirms funding approval for SI BMS and a trilateral arrangement including SI, PNG and Australia is developed.
- April 2024, SI and PNG create Capacity Building Action Plan and host the first BMS workshop with stakeholders in Honiara.



PNG-Solomon Island border cooperation continues

THE Papua New Guinea and Solomon Islands governments are continuing their cooperation on border

The PNG Immigration Citizenship Service Authority (PN-GICSA) and Solomon

Islands Immigration JOHN Rosso Division (SIID) com-

pleted a two-day Border Management System (BMS) workshop in Honiara last week.

The workshop, which was held on April 22-23, was a consultation with Solomon Islands national stakeholders which included Foreign Investment, Labour, Police, the Information Communication and Technology Service Unit, and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and External Trade, on the SIID BMS project.

SIID. "In the workshop in Port Moresby, both agencies discussed capacity building options, and mapped out the foundations to explore, identify, and select, a Border Management System for the Solomon Islands," Mr. Rosso said.

"The workshop in Honiara, introduced the BMS to the stakeholders in the Solomon Islands and explained why it is needed."

"I understand that SIID is developing a new visa regime which will be implemented soon, and to go online to support investment, facilitate travel, trade, and tourism."

The proposal to procure a BMS for SIID will be funded by the Australian government through the Department of Home Affairs.


